Some examples of Results Chains.

Your country might use something similar, for example in a National Health Plan. In this case, use the same headings as used in the National Health Plan.

These examples demonstrate that there is no single “ideal” way to organize a Results Chain or to turn that into a full program logic matrix..

'Logframe' Definitions...

Goal	The future situation to which the development intervention contributes significantly but cannot achieve alone.
Objective [Outcomes]	What difference <u>we</u> make: describes the situation to prevail at the 'end' of the development activity. Describes the <u>changes</u> in behaviors or situations required to contribute to our goal . _
Outputs	Results of what we <u>do</u> : the product/services or achievement of the activities we do and the people reached Considered to be within the control of the program
Activities	What we <u>do</u> : Describes the activities and people targeted or participating Must be specific, tangible and time-bound
Inputs	Identifies the resources, staff and infrastructure required to do the activities
